

KALI MURIATICUM

Potassium chloride



Thick whitish mucus

ENT disorders:

Tonsillar crypts with thick whitish discharge, with an unpleasant odor.

Tubal catarrh with intermittent deafness, cracking and popping sounds in the ears.

Digestive disorders:

Hepatobiliary dyspepsia with headache and vomiting of white and thick mucus. Tongue covered with a white coating.

Cutaneous disorders:

Post-inflammatory or chronic edema. Painful cellulitic edema.

Eruption of vesicles containing a thick white liquid, followed by fine desquamation (zoster, eczema, herpes).

Aggravation

- from the cold open air,
- from humidity

Improvement

- with dry warmth
